World of Work week—14th – 18th October 2019 Ringinglow site

Our WOW week was a huge success with many employers visiting the school to showcase careers and work opportunities. Our students asked so many relevant and worthwhile questions and engaged really well with our visitors.

Halo Nails: A group of Y10 and Y11 girls visited Halo Nail studio at Banner Cross. The students listened to the owner Amy talk about her career and the business and explored the salon. The students were treated to a file and polish and had a dance and singing session!

South Yorkshire Fire & Rescue: Chris and Toby spoke to all students about being safe around fire, the importance

of testing smoke alarms and having an evacuation plan. We all now understand the stop, drop and roll technique – please ask us to demonstrate! The students asked lots of questions involving careers within the Fire Service.



WOW carousel: All students had a carousel of 20 minute talks from a wide range of employers informing us about their companies, their roles and their education and career progression.

Paul from **First Bus** provided us with facts about the travel industry and answered many questions on the role of bus drivers. Paul provided us with pens and bus maps of Sheffield which Hamaad (4JR) said "Will be very useful for me as it will help me with my independence skills." Jo and Peter from **Co-op** Ecclesall Road brought food tasters and uniform for us to try on. They told us that work experience usually starts at age 15 and employment from age 16. They've invited us into store to

practice on their tills! Emily (3AM) now would like to work there!

Mark and Moray from **South Yorkshire Police** were a big hit with the students. We found out about a day in the life of a Police Officer, how to catch criminals internationally and how eco-friendly their vehicles are. They will be back soon with Police vans for us to explore!

Katie and Rebecca from **Cranswick Country Foods** talked about working in factories. They have jobs in lots of areas. They gave us squeezy pigs which were popular. Tyler (4DP) enjoyed learning about farming and pigs.

Melany from **National Trust** at the Longshaw Estate wowed us with photos of beautiful landscapes, stories of working outside and brought real life antlers in for the students to explore. We will work with the National Trust again next year but all young people are invited to help out at their free Muck In days on the second Sunday of every month 10am-12.30pm.
