World of Work Emergency Services and Medical Day - Wednesday 15th January 2020

On Wednesday 15th January we had the pleasure of welcoming employees from RNLI, Sheffield Children's Hospital, Yorkshire Ambulance Service and South Yorkshire Police into school. Classes had 20 minute sessions with the different visitors which allowed the students to become more informed about the many different careers and jobs within these four organisations and also helped reinforce safety and medical advice. And we had so much fun!!



Ali from RNLI told us about the many roles and work places available. Students told her where they had seen Lifeboat stations at Scarborough and Cleethorpes. We tried lifeguard uniform on and discovered the colours match the safe swimming flags.



Comments from our students were "I liked doing the sessions like the RNLI about staying safe. I learnt a lot."

"I liked talking about the Lifeboat station at Scarborough. I go there will my family. The staff there help people to stay safe."

Chantelle from Ward 5 at Sheffield Children's Hospital told us the best part of her job is working with people - patients, families and colleagues. We enjoyed seeing the photos of the hospital and discussing how it has changed. The students enjoyed using the torches and blood pressure cuffs! Comments from our students were "I liked putting the oxygen mask on." "I asked questions about transitioning from the Children's hospital to the adults."



We were thrilled that 2 **PCSOs from Woodseats Police Station** brought a Police Van for us to explore whilst we learnt about the many roles within the Police Service. Students asked questions about the battering ram and felt how heavy it was. We all enjoyed pretending to drive the van! Our students said "I liked driving the police car and saying 'This is the police, pull over! Put your hands above your head and kneel on the ground!'" "I liked the police van because I was riding in the police van. I liked hearing the siren."

Ali from Yorkshire Ambulance Service delivered a practical CPR session with every student., she talked about all the people involved in the Ambulance Service including the control team, IT and paramedics. "I learnt a lot. I liked putting my hand up to answer questions about 999." "I tried really hard to push down on the dummy. I was practising what to do in an emergency."



Our next WOW event will be on Wednesday 4th March 2020 to coincide with National Careers Week. We have many visitors planned but they will all be a mystery to the students and staff! The students will work together to ask yes/no questions to find out who they are and what they do!
