As we near the end of another school year, we're excited to share all the great things happening across our school sites. We've been busy with lots of activities and achievements that really show what Bents Green School is all about.

We've been working hard to help our new Year 6 pupils feel welcome. They've been visiting all our sites to get to know their new school. This helps them feel more comfortable and part of our community before they start in September.

At Ringinglow, we've had some fantastic events. We held another Religious Studies Day, helping our pupils learn about different beliefs. Our Year 10s went on a trip to Thornbridge Outdoor Centre, where they worked on teamwork and leadership skills. We also celebrated Languages Day, focusing on Arabic this time.

School Gateway Login details

How to activate your account

Download the Android or iPhone app.





Press 'Sign Up' then enter the email and mobile number your school has on record. If you're not sure if they have the right details, it's best to check and update first.

Press 'Send PIN'. You will receive a text message with your unique PIN.

You're now ready to log in and start using School Gateway.

If you don't have a smartphone or prefer to use a computer, you can set up your account using the web version of School Gateway.



How to log in

Once you have your PIN, go ahead and launch the School Gateway app on your smartphone or tablet.

Enter the email you have registered with your school and the PIN you received. If you didn't get a PIN, it is likely because your school doesn't have the right contact info. Get in touch with them to check.

If both the email and PIN are entered correctly, hit 'Login' and you're ready to start engaging with your school.
