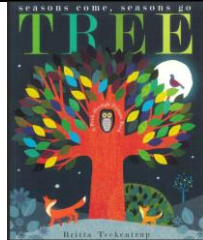


Skill Focus: engaging with a story

This will be read as a sensory story, with props and resources to engage the children's senses, such as ice (melting snow), a fan (wind) and printing with leaves (Autumn)

We will also be sharing favourite stories. Please let us know your child's favourite book.

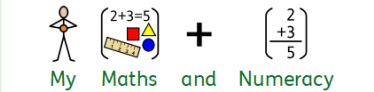

Area: Comparison

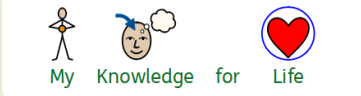
We will be comparing quantities of different objects, learning about "one" and "lots". We will continue to count, play with numbers, sing number songs and practice tracing numerals.

We will be learning about the weather as it changes through the seasons, and engaging with the sensory weather songs.

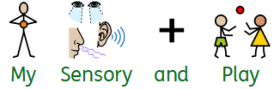


We will be learning about seasons through sensory and creative activities such as exploring ice, cutting up and smelling leaves and flowers, watching short videos and engaging in sensory massage.

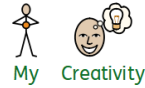

We will continue to build relationships with the adults in our class, spending time with them at activities we choose.

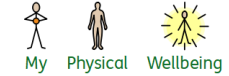


We will continue to explore the toys and resources in our classroom, choosing what we want to play with. Provision includes blocks, animals, people, vehicles, pens and paper, fidget toys, and books. We will have access to sensory resources such as paint, cornflour and water, dry cereals, slime and playdough. We love to explore these!

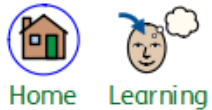


We will be printing onto tree shapes with ear buds, cotton wool, leaves, fingers and glitter to create different trees for different seasons. We will be listening to songs about the Seasons, including Vivaldi's Four Seasons.

We will continue to sing our favourite songs and Nursery Rhymes, using instruments to tap along, and dance to some of our favourite songs.



We will spend time with Sonia, our PE teacher, in the classroom relaxing, practising yoga and listening to calming music. We might go to the swing room or activity suite and play with balls or dance to different types of music.
