





Term – Autumn 1 Independence Pathway – Olive Class Ice, Water, Fire




Skill Focus: Reading - comprehension

We will be reading a selection of picture books around our theme of 'ice, water, fire'. We will be listening carefully to the stories and then working on skills such as retrieval, inference, prediction and retelling.

Skill focus: Writing – constructing sentences

We will be writing descriptive sentences based on the picture books we are reading. We will be practising writing our letters correctly, using accurate punctuation and extending our sentences with conjunctions.



Area: Properties of Number

We will learn about place value within whole numbers and will be able to compare and order numbers. We will undertake calculations using mental arithmetic and using a calculator. We will understand the terms odd and even, and rounding will be introduced. We will also be able to count in different multiples including 2, 5 and 10.



Life skills – Walking out in the community in a safe and sensible manner and following instructions outside of the school setting.

Cooking – Embedding the routine of using the new cooking room including putting on an apron, washing hands, and tying hair back. We will be cooking cakes, biscuits and chapatis.



Area: My Self Awareness

We will be working on developing our understanding of the Zones of Regulation tools to enable us to recognise and process our own emotions. We will work to develop personal toolkits to manage our emotions and help with our own regulation.



Subject Area: Geography and Science

We will be looking at the different states of matter – solids, liquids and gases and we will be exploring changes in state, including melting and freezing. We will be learning about seas, oceans and rivers across the world as well as the north and south pole. In our 'fire' learning, we will be investigating volcanoes and making our own!



A range of continuous provision activities will be available in the classroom to allow pupils to learn through their own self-directed play. Examples include building blocks, small world play, tuff trays with sand and water and more structured board games. Students will also have daily access to the sensory rooms around school.



We have been exploring a range of water and ice based creative activities, such as transferring colour using tissue paper and water, and painting with water colours. There are also daily opportunities to engage in painting, drawing and mark-making during freeflow continuous provision time.



We will be focussing on team building games to develop relationships with each other, but we will also be working on EHCP based targets such as social interaction and communication, turn taking skills, and fine and gross motor skills.
