THE CIVIL SERVICE SECTOR

The Civil Service helps the government of the day develop and implement its policies as effectively as possible.

The Civil Service provides services directly to people all over the country, including:

- Paying Benefits
- Pensions Running
- Employment Services
- Running Prisons
- Issuing Driving Licences

The Civil Service also has staff working on policy development and implementation, including analysts, project managers, lawyers and economists.

People working for the Civil Service are known as Civil servants and they do very important work. The scale, complexity and impact of the work civil servants do is unrivalled. Whatever you do and wherever you work, a career in the Civil Service is an opportunity to make a difference.

Sheffield is home to several big Civil Service offices, including those for the Department for Education, Department for Work and Pensions and the Home Office

USEFUL SKILLS

- As the Civil Service is accountable to the public it needs to meet the highest possible standards.
 Skills and qualities expected include:
- **Integrity** putting the obligations of public service above personal interests
- Honesty being truthful and open
- **Objectivity** basing advice and decisions on rigorous analysis of the evidence
- Impartiality acting solely according to the merits of the case and serving governments of different political parties equally well

ROUTES INTO EMPLOYMENT IN THIS SECTOR

- Moving directly into a Civil Service job (these can be permanent or fixed-term contracts, full-time or part-time) you can start a job search now
- A 2-year Civil Service Fast Track apprenticeship programme
- The Civil Service Fast Stream programme for graduates
- The Summer Diversity Internship programme for ethnic minority students, disabled students and those from underrepresented socio-economic backgrounds
- The Early Diversity Internship programme for ethnic minority students and those from under-represented socio-economic backgrounds
- The Movement to Work scheme which offers work experience in the Civil Service for unemployed young people
- Student placement
